CEDAW and Australia: Does it matter and what difference can it make?

Dec.3rd – Dec.10th on Gender Equality Online (www.genderequalityonline.org.au)

For the 2010 16 Days of Activism to End Violence against Women UNIFEM Australia (part of UN Women) is focusing on the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW). This year the Australian Government provided its 6th and 7th combined reports to the CEDAW Committee in New York. Since this time, the Committee has released their concluding comments on the Australian Government’s compliance with CEDAW. There has not yet been a response by the Australian Government. Issues in Australia that remain of significant concern to the Committee include persistent high levels of violence against women particularly against migrant and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander populations; insufficient legal frameworks to protect women against violence; and recommendations that Australia remove its remaining two reservations to the Optional Protocol.
